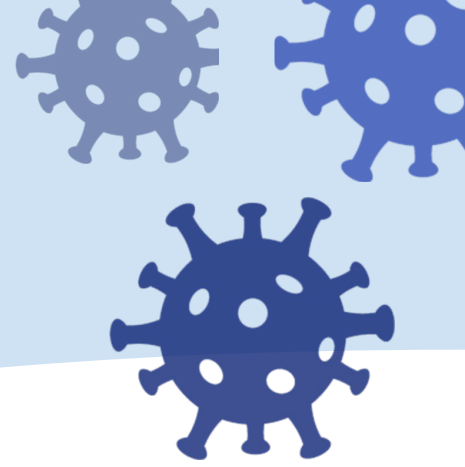


COVID-19 testing in local LA County neighborhoods. Free, easy, safe.



As more people get vaccinated, it is still important to get tested.

- COVID-19 testing is key to protecting loved ones.
- By knowing if you have COVID-19, you can help stop the spread by isolating yourself immediately and protect yourself and others.

When should I get tested?

Everyone:

- If you have symptoms.
- If you were asked by a doctor or Public Health to get tested.

If you **have not** yet received a vaccine, or are not fully vaccinated* yet, you should get tested (even if you don't have symptoms):

- If you know for sure that you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19,
- Or if you believe you have been exposed to COVID-19.

If **you've** been fully vaccinated, you should get tested (even if you don't have symptoms):

- If you live in a group setting or work in a crowded place (like a correctional facility, group home or factory) and are around someone who has COVID-19.

Getting tested is easier than ever.

- **Testing is free.**
- Some locations do not require an appointment. You can walk up and get tested.
- There are locations in your community, including at selected churches and faith-based organizations, and many offer walk-up or drive-up testing.

Your personal information is safe and private.

- You do not need a driver's license or Social Security number.
- Free testing is available **regardless of immigration status.**

To get a test, call your doctor first. If you don't have a doctor, call 211 or visit www.covid19.lacounty.gov/testing

** If it has been less than two weeks since your vaccine, or if you still need to get your second dose, you are NOT fully vaccinated and NOT fully protected.*
